³ There's more to come: We continue to shout our praise even when we're hemmed in with troubles, because we know how troubles can develop passionate patience in us, ⁴ and how that patience in turn forges the tempered steel of virtue, keeping us alert for whatever God will do next. ⁵ In alert expectancy such as this, we're never left feeling shortchanged. Quite the contrary—we can't round up enough containers to hold everything God generously pours into our lives through the Holy Spirit!

Joy is a choice. Therefore...

- Our joy is not dependent on *circumstances*.
- Our joy is not dependent on *other people*.
- Our joy is not dependent on *our emotions*.

Joy is the settled assurance that God is in control of all the details of my life, the quiet confidence that ultimately everything is going to be all right, and the determined choice to praise God in all things.

So joy is...

- A settled conviction about God.
- A quiet confidence *in God*.
- A determined choice to give my praise *to God*.
